Activities Phase-In

In accordance with the COVID-19 staging guidelines issued by the State of Idaho, GSE Management has devised a plan for resuming some of our regularly scheduled activities. The Clubhouse is open for use, and we will not prevent anyone from participating in activities at their discretion. However, we will not be scheduling activities that do not meet the staging guidelines.

Guidelines applicable to our community were considered in order to determine what activities would be appropriate, including:

- Vulnerable people can resume public interactions but should maintain distancing unless precautionary measures are observed.
- Gatherings of 10 to 50 people are allowed if appropriate distancing and precautionary measures are observed (Stage 3).
- Gatherings of over 50 people are allowed if appropriate distancing and precautionary measures are observed (Stage 4).

Stage 3, estimated May 30 through June 12

During Stage 3, the Clubhouse will remain open for use by **Residents only**. A Resident is a person named on the Lease Agreement with Golden Spike.

These activities fall within the staging guidelines as long as all participants use distancing and precautionary measures:

Stage 4, estimated June 13 through June 26

During Stage 4, the Clubhouse will be open for use by **Residents and Guests**.

No additional activities will resume during Stage 4. Games and other activities that require participants to sit close to each other and/or share the use of items do not fall into the guidelines of either stage and will have to resume once further guidelines are issued or all restrictions are lifted.
